WOOD SUMMER CLUB & SUMMER THEATER CLUB REGISTRATION



Maywood Summer Club provides a full day program for children entering Kindergarten - 8th Grade. The program ends Friday, August 17, 2018. Regular hours are 8:30am-3pm with available aftercare 3:15pm-6pm. The resident rate is \$100 weekly and aftercare \$75 weekly. The non-resident rate is \$125 weekly and aftercare \$100 weekly. Participants are dropped off at the Maywood Municipal Pool every morning except Wednesday for supervised swim

while the pool is closed to the public. Counselors will coordinate Maywood Dolphin Swim Team practice and swim lessons (separate fee). Afternoons are spent at either Maywood Avenue School (through Friday, August 3, 2018) or Memorial School (Monday, August 6, 2018-Friday, August 17, 2018). Aftercare is located at the Senior Recreation Center. Wednesdays are trip days and participants should be dropped off and picked up at Maywood Avenue School (through Friday, August 3, 2018) or Memorial School (Monday, August 6, 2018-Friday, August 17, 2018).

Maywood Summer Theater Club is performing Seussical Jr. Children in grade 3-9 will meet Monday-Friday 9am-3pm at the Maywood Recreation Center (145 West Magnolia Avenue). The program begins Monday, July 2, 2018 and ends on Saturday, August 18, 2018. The tuition is \$600 and 3 performances are planned; Thursday, August 16, Friday, August 17, and Saturday, August 18, 2018 at 7pm.

BERGEN COUNTY MOSQUITO CONTROL PROGRAM

This is the time of the year to take steps to eliminate stagnant water which is where most mosquitoes breed:

- Dispose of cans, buckets, plastic containers, ceramic pots or similar containers that hold water on your property.
- Properly dispose of discarded tires that can collect water.
- Drill drainage holes in the bottom of outdoor recycling containers.
- Clean clogged roof gutters if the leaves from surrounding trees tend to
- Turn over plastic wading pools when not in use.
- Turn over wheelbarrows and don't let water stagnate in birdbaths.
- Aerate ornamental pools or stock them with fish.
- Clean and chlorinate swimming pools not in use and remove any water that may collect on pool covers.


For stagnant pools of water, homeowners can buy BTI products at lawn and garden, outdoor supply, home improvement and other stores. This naturally occurring bacteria kills mosquito larva, but is safe for people, pets, wildlife, aquatic life and plants. Bergen County Mosquito Control will provide BTI spraying for residential properties free of charge. To contact the Bergen County Division of Mosquito Control about a mosquito problem, call 201-634-2880.

Additionally, these simple precautions can prevent mosquito bites:

- Make sure screens fit tightly over doors and windows to keep mosquitoes out of homes.
- Consider wearing long-sleeved shirts, long pants and socks when outdoors, particularly when mosquitoes are most active at dawn and dusk, or in areas known for having large numbers of mosquitoes.
- When possible, reduce outdoor exposure at dawn and dusk during peak mosquito periods, usually April through October.
- Use insect repellants according to the manufacturer's instructions. An effective repellant will contain DEET, picaridin or oil of lemon eucalyptus. Consult with a pediatrician or family physician if you have guestions about the use of repellent on children, as repellant is not recommended for children under the age of two months.

CARTON RECYCLING NOW AVAILABLE IN MAYWOOD

Maywood residents can recycle food and beverage cartons as part of the curbside recycling program with the commingled collection (plastic, cans & glass). We are proud to expand the list of accepted recyclables and continue our mission to conserve energy and natural resources and protect the environment.

There are two types of cartons: shelf-stable (found on grocery store shelves – juice, milk, soy milk, soup, broth, wine), and refrigerated (found in the refrigerated section of grocery stores – milk, juice, cream, liquid eggs). Both types of cartons can be recycled.

Recycling cartons is as easy as 1-2-3:

- Empty your food and beverage cartons.
- Add cartons to your recycling bin with glass, metal and plastic containers.
- Take your recycling bin to the curb on collection day.

Once the cartons are collected, they are separated from other recyclable materials at the recycling sorting center. From there, they are either used to create paper products, such as paper towels and tissues, or building materials, such as ceiling tiles and roof cover board.

MAYWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT CHILD PASSENGER SAFETY



Under New Jersey law, children under 8 years of age must be secured in a child passenger restraint system or booster seat. An amended version of this law went into effect on September 1, 2015:

- Children under the age of 2 and weighing less than 30 lbs. MUST be in a rear-facing car seat with a 5-point harness. The car seat must be in a rear seat of the vehicle.
- From age 2 through age 4 and weighing up to 40lbs., children must be secured in a seat with a 5-point harness, either rear-facing (up to height & weight limits of the particular seat) or forward-facing in a rear seat of the vehicle.
- For age 4 until age 8 and less than 57" (4'-9"), children must be seated in either a car seat with a 5-point harness or a booster seat in a rear seat of the vehicle.
- Ages 8 and up must wear a properly adjusted and fastened seat belt.
- If there are no rear seats (e.g., standard cab pickup truck), the child must be secured in an appropriate car seat or booster seat for their age, weight and height in the front passenger seat. If the child is in a rear-facing car seat, the passenger side airbag must be disabled or turned off.

Often times, first-time parents or caregivers are uncomfortable with the installation of a child seat. In many instances, it has been found that a large percentage of child seats are not installed properly and additional help is needed to get the installation correct. To assist with this, Child Passenger Safety Technicians are trained to help parents and caregivers. Police Officer Erik Aronson is the Maywood Police Department Child Passenger Safety Technician.
